PE and Sport Premium

Mission Statement

As a Catholic school, St Wulstan's seeks to enable each child to walk in faith with Christ, loving Him and each other. With the help of our families, our parish and our local community, we will do our best to use the gifts that God has given us to make our world a richer place.

In the academic year 2017-18, St Wulstan's received approximately £17,650 as part of the PE and Sports Funding initiative for schools. This is calculated as £16,000 grant plus £10 per pupil. This funding must be used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer.

This means that our school should use the premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that St Wulstan's already offer
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in the future

At St Wulstan's we use the PE and Sports Premium in the following ways:

Sports Partnership

The Hagley Schools Sports Partnership enables pupils to experience competitive and non-competitive sporting activities in a variety of sports. St Wulstan's pupils have the opportunity to compete against other St Nicholas Owen Academy schools in sports events, which offers a valuable experience in participating in activities and environments that cannot be replicated in school. Tournaments are organised on a regular basis encouraging self-belief, raising self-esteem and developing an interest in sport. As part of the programme Hagley Catholic High School specialist PE teachers plan and lead sports activities together with young leaders who are valuable role models as they too develop valuable skills and techniques in coaching.

Specialist P.E. teaching

A specialist PE member of staff will work alongside a member of staff teaching PE from Year 1 to Year 6 during afternoon sessions. The teaching programme covers fundamental skills, competition and introduction of new sports.

West Mercia Police Tag Rugby

Specialist Tag rugby coaches have coached Key Stage 2 children culminating in a local schools tag rugby tournament developing, sporting skills, teamwork and an interest in an alternative sport. Teacher staff are now continuing this coaching in usual games lessons.

Jumping Jaxx

Jumping Jaxx play leader training provides older pupils with the opportunity to have an increased level of responsibility and support younger pupils during playtime. Daily multi skills with groups of EYFS/KS1 pupils engages them in active games and activities developing gross motor skills, team playing and focused physical activities at playtime.

Swimming

Pupils in Year 3 and Year 4 travel to Abberley Hall to attend weekly swimming lessons taught by a specialist swimming coach. Children to receive 'top-up' sessions to ensure confidence in the water before leaving in Year 6.

Sports equipment

Sports equipment has been purchased for pupils in both KS1 and KS2 to use both in PE lessons and at playtimes. Examples of purchases are: basketball stands, netball hoops, sports day equipment, tag rugby equipment, athletics equipment.

After school clubs

Netball, Key Stage 1 football, Key Stage 2 football, Cross country and Athletics clubs are run by teaching staff at different points of the year. St Wulstan's pupils participate in the Worcestershire Catholic Schools Association tournaments of football, netball, athletics and swimming, Alongside skill development these tournaments develop competition, team work and sportsmanship.

Kidderminster Harriers Football Club

Each term KHFC runs a weekly after school football club for pupils in Year 2 to Year 6 developing football skills and team playing. In the summer term all pupils participate in a healthy fun session in their PE lesson run by KHFC coaches. Year 6 experience a six week programme of 'Health Kick' focusing on healthy bodies through sport, healthy lifestyle and diet.

Residential Activity weekend

St Wulstan's Year 5 pupils participate in an annual residential activity weekend every September. The pupils have the opportunity to experience new sporting activities for example, canoeing, kayaking, archery, fencing, climbing, abseiling, hill walking, obstacle courses, orienteering.

Singing Playgrounds

St Wulstan's Year 6 children will receive training to become 'Song Leaders'. Children to promote and develop well-being through dance and song at lunchtimes.
