


- There is a clear spiritual emphasis, with time to pray and to reflect on how God works in our lives.

The trip.....

- Set off at approximately 1:15pm on Wednesday 28 June. We will arrive at around 3:45pm in time for our 4:00pm check in. We will notify you to say that we have arrived safely.
- A quick tour of the castle, bags to rooms, then time for dinner.
- More activities take place, followed by evening prayer then it is time for bed.
- The following day starts with breakfast followed by morning prayer.
- Various activities take place throughout that day along with lunch and dinner!
- The evening then continues with hymn practice, Mass in the church and is topped off by an 'Entertainment'!
- Final night prayer is followed by bed time (hooray)!
- Our final day follows the same format as the day before with the exception of us heading home after lunch.
- Expected arrival back at school is 4:00pm on Friday 30 June (depending on traffic).

POCKET MONEY - Children can bring some pocket money with them. There is a tuck/souvenir shop which is opened at break times.

WHAT TO BRING - every child requires:

- sleeping bag/duvet (mattress sheet, pillow & pillowcase provided by Alton Castle)
- indoor and outdoor shoes,
- an old pair of trainers
- walking boots (if you have them)
- a warm sweater
- suncream (for the summer)
- at least 3 complete changes of clothing (several warm layers are recommended if your retreat is in cold weather e.g. vest, T-shirt, thin jumper, fleece or woolly jumper)
- plenty of socks
- waterproof jacket
- an inexpensive watch is useful
- toiletries and wash towel
- wellingtons
- Mass a smart outfit and clean shoes/trainers (not worn for an activity)
